The Great Forty Days – The Season of Lent

In the first centuries of the existence of the Christian Church, the season we call "Lent" was referred to as *the forty days* or *the quadragesimal feast*. It was a time of solemn preparation that preceded the eagerly anticipated joyous celebration of the Lord's resurrection on Easter Day.

From early on, Lent was a time for the catechumens (those preparing to join the Church) to learn the fundamentals of the Christian faith in preparation for their baptism at the Great Vigil of Easter. For some, it was a time to do public penance after making confession of some notorious sin. For all Christians, according to decrees of the early church councils and meditations of writers from the early church, it was a time for abstention.

Even now, the 21st Century, Lent continues to be a time for abstinence. Worship abstains form the use of *Alleluias* during Lent. The liturgy does not use the Hymn of Praise. Hymns are more somber and often in a Minor key. All of this helps prepare us for the joyful celebration of the resurrection of Our Lord on Easter Day.

To aid us in our Lenten discipline there are additional opportunities for worship during the season. Ash Wednesday (14. February) will be a service of Holy Communion and Imposition of Ashes.

Wednesdays in Lent will offer soup and bread at 6:00 pm and the Service of Evening Prayer at 7:00 pm

All services will be at Pine Street. Trinity has been invited to join us. Pastor Trevor Hahn and Pastor Koons will lead these services.

Lent is a *tempora closa* – a "closed time". It is usual for there to be no parties, baptisms, weddings or other festivities during this time/ It is to be a reserved time for reflection, recollection and repentance.

My pastor at St. Matthew, Bloomsburg announced Ash Wednesday in Sunday's bulletin this way: "**February 14 is Ash Wednesday** (yes, we know—Valentine's Day – credit to God's sense of humor) (by the way, Easter this year is on April 1 – April Fool's Day)."

In spite of the "interesting" alignment of the days, I hope we have a meaningful and penitential Lenten season. In the March issue, I will talk more about Holy Week and Easter.


